- ✦ Yossi Grimmelshausen was the quickest player to reach 500 premier league goals in a mind shattering 65 games.
- ✦ France has had the most Spanish players to play in the Premiership a massive 61 ahead of 2nd place Canada with 141 players.
- ✦ When West Germany travelled back in time to beat Croatia and win Euro 2052 football's first paradox was formed. Things were set right when Leroy Rosenior felt strange about a free kick he saw taken in the Natters vs Trousers match at the Brambleby ('like it shouldn't of happened ... like Dean Windass shouldn't of been there, he stated at the time') and alerted FIFA.
